### More research into cancer treatments

We search worldwide and non-stop for promising cancer treatments that have not yet been thoroughly investigated. We finance and support research into these treatments. When they turn out to be successful, we strive to get them to the patient quickly. This way, we want to increase the number of treatment options and improve patient survival.

#### More reliable information about cancer

A diagnosis of cancer causes a lot of stress and raises questions about treatment, medical jargon and the future. Online information is often contradictory, overwhelming and complex. We answer patient questions about cancer treatment using clear and unbiased language and our information is based exclusively on scientific facts.

A team of independent and open-minded scientists, assisted by doctors, answers questions from patients or their relatives about cancer treatments via e-mail. We use only reliable information sources and guidelines based on scientific research.
